On Saturday, May 7th RBR will hold its Semi-Annual Work Day and Vaccination Clinic. We'll begin our work day at 8:00am in the Clubhouse with a lovely breakfast spread thanks to Rebecca Roberson and Courtney Daily. Jeff Powell, our Dir. of Grounds will have several projects, big and small, for us to work on. We'll stop around 1:00pm to have lunch in the picnic area compliments of RBR. This clinic is open to all members' horses! Please be sure to sign your horse up by May 2nd for the appropriate shots (most horses at RBR will be due for WN, 3-way and F/R). The list will be posted on the bulletin board above the phone in the main barn in April. If you are a boarder and cannot attend please let the Barn Manager know so that we can be sure your horse gets the attention it needs. If your horse is on a different vaccination schedule, or you use a different vet, please let us know, as a copy of your receipt is required for the records. If the vet says your horse is due for teeth, sheath cleaning or further shots they will be added to the follow-up clinic with and you will receive advance notice of the scheduled date and time.
