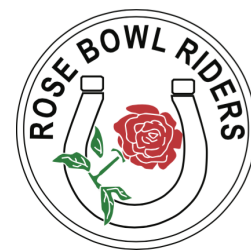
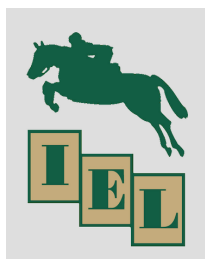

## New! Online Renewals and Member Directory through Wild Apricot
